CITY MARSHAL DAVID FORD

City Attorney Nathan Nickolaus stated that if marijuana dispensatories were to open in Fayette, the city would begin to receive revenue from those businesses due to the new three percent tax law voted in at the April 4, 2023 election.

Grafton Cook

Grafton Cook of Fayette Community Improvement District requested approval to proceed with a traffic study the CID Board is about to undertake.

Alderwoman Galloway motioned to approve the CID proceed with the traffic study. Alderwoman Ford seconded the motion. Five voting Aye. Nays -0. Motion carried.

Mr. Cook also asked the council to consider undertaking a study of the electrical grid for the potential for EV charging stations around the square. Toth & Associates would be contacted to do the study.

Regina Powell asked if more gravel could be added to West Depot Street to widen the road. Mr. Dougherty said he would take care of it.

Matt Klusmeyer

Matt Klusmeyer of the Fayette Disc Golf Organization stated that he met with the Parks Committee regarding the disc golf course and their role and plans and improvements the organization has, partnering with the city for the course going forward including fundraising.

Utilities Office Manager DaShayla Bush sent a written explanation to the council why both Utilities Office employees would not be available to work on May 16, 2023.
