ADDITIONS TO AND APPROVAL OF AGENDA.

Alderwoman O'Connell motioned to approve the August 22, 2023 agenda with the correction (See attached amendments). Alderwoman Ishmael seconded the motion. Six voting Aye. Nays – none. Motion carried.

PUBLIC HEARING TO FIX THE AD VALOREM PROPERTY TAX RATES OF THE CITY OF FAYETTE FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023

VISITORS

Connie Ford

Connie Ford, representing Missouri Public Utility Alliance (MPUA) announced that the City of Fayette's application for funding from the MoPEP Infrastructure Grant Program was approved and a check was presented to the City for meter replacement upgrades in the amount of \$48,469.00.

Caleb Walker

Caleb Walker of Heritage Insurance presented an insurance quote for renewal of the City's insurance. Mr. Walker explained that the wind/hail deductible would be going up to 1% of the claim or \$50,000.00 minimum and that the premium would be \$10,000.00 to \$15,000.00 higher than last year. Mr. Walker will obtain a quote from another company and bring his findings to the next meeting.

Joey McLiney & Mike Hall

Joey McLiney and Mike Hall representing the Howard County Regional Water Commission were scheduled to bring information about the City's upcoming water rate increase, but were unable to attend and will be at the next meeting.

Gary & Kelly Beeler

Gary and Kelly Beeler shared their concerns regarding the shortage of parking on their street which makes it difficult when they have visitors and would like the same side of street as their house is on to have parking again. Mayor Dawson stated that the council needed more time to check signs and ordinances and bring information to the next meeting.

CITIZEN PARTICIPATION

Jeff Parks

Jeff Parks commented that he was still working with Central Methodist University to resolve the situation with the damaged wall of his business. He also shared his disapproval of the judgement of the murder charge of the CMU student.

Rebecca Fenton

Rebecca Fenton of 507 Linn Street commented on her disapproval of changing the current status of No Parking on her street and said that she has been blocked in her driveway on several occasions.

George Beford

George Beford gave his comments on the parking on Linn Street and was one who was instrumental in getting the no parking of the street instituted. He said the street was too narrow for parking and that snowplows couldn't get through.

Alderwoman Gerlt seconded the motion. Four voting Aye. Nays – two. Motion carried.

One bid was received for the 1989 AMGE Humvee from Sterling Birch in the amount of \$12,517.00. Alderwoman O'Connell motioned to accept the bid for the amount of the bid. Alderwoman Broadus seconded the motion. Six voting Aye. Nays – None. Motion carried.

DISCUSSION AND/OR APPROVAL OF REQUEST FOR EXCESS SEWER CHARGES

Alderwoman Galloway motioned to approve the waiver of excess sewer charges for 105 N. Howard Street. Alderwoman Ford seconded the motion. Six voting Aye. Nays – None. Motion carried.

DISCUSSION AND/OR APPROVAL OF AN EXTENSION OF UTILITY PAYMENT

Extension of utility payment for 102 Boyd Street was funded by the Central Missouri Community Action Center, so no council approval was needed.

<u>DISCUSSION AND/OR APPROVAL OF PAYMENT OF FINAL INVOICE FOR SPLASH PAD LABOR, EQUIPMENT AND MATERIALS, PAYABLE TO IDEAL LANDSCAPE GROUP</u>

Alderwoman Galloway motioned to table the final payment to Ideal Landscape until the next meeting and the council could hear from the Public Works Director, Danny Dougherty on the status of the Splash Park. Alderwoman Ford seconded the motion. Six voting Aye. Nays – None. Motion carried.

REVIEW OF CITIZEN NOTIFICATION LETTER OF TREE TRIMMING OR REMOVAL

The council reviewed and accepted a citizen's letter drafted by Alderwoman Galloway to be given to citizens before tree trimming and/or removal will be done on their property, by City crews. A copy of the letter will be given to the homeowner as well as posted in the newspaper and on the City's website in the fall when tree trimming begins.

DISCUSSION AND/OR APPROVAL OF RECOMMENDATION TO HIRE OWN, INC., AS CONSULTING ENGINEER FOR PARKING & TRAFFIC STUDY IN SUPPORT OF CID

Alderwoman O'Connell motioned to approve the recommendation by the Historic Downtown Fayette Commercial Community Improvement District (CID) to hire Own, Inc. as the consulting engineer for the parking and traffic study to be done. Alderwoman Galloway seconded the motion. Six voting Aye. Nays – None. Motion carried.

The City of Fayette will serve as the contracting agent and the CID will act as the Owner's Representative.

BOARD OF ALDERMAN COMMENTS & COMMITTEE UPDATES

Alderwoman Ronda Gerlt

Alderwoman Gerlt stated that Rebecca Fenton had emailed the council members and included pictures regarding her parking situation on Linn Street and Mrs. Gerlt commented that she agreed that there was a real problem.

Mrs. Gerlt approved of the repairs on the Spring Street Bridge but commented that the rocks looked dangerous.

Mrs. Gerlt would like to see the visual of the Central Methodist University's Church Street project. Mayor Dawson will reach out to them.

Alderwoman Bekki Galloway

Alderwoman Galloway was concerned on parking in the city.

Alderwoman Peggy O'Connell

Alderwoman O'Connell stated that the Fayette Historic Preservation Commission met on August 9, 2023. The meeting items included that the HPC needs two more members, they voted to keep the boundaries the same for the historic district, incentives for buildings in the historic district, like sign grants. Other items were design guidelines, CLG training in October and Tax Credit Workshop at the Main Street building for Main Street and CID members.

Alderwoman Michelle Ishmael

Alderwoman Ishmael commented on the rocks at the Spring Street Bridge and her concern about field erosion and children getting hurt.

Mrs. Ishmael reported that it was reported that there had been reports of people using jet skies on D.C. Rogers Lake and was told to call police if anymore sightings occurred.

Alderwoman Marsha Broadus

City of Fayette: Board of Aldermen Meeting Minutes, August 22, 2023

Alderwoman Broadus wanted to know when the hole on South Park Street would be fixed. Mayor Dawson explained that the City crews do several places at once and he would talk to Danny Dougherty regarding the matter.

Ms. Broadus commented that she was concerned about a house that has no sewer. Mayor Dawson will talk to Mr. Dougherty when he returns.
